Monthly Activity Report SEP 2011

INTRODUCTION:

This reporting period represents the final month of our peak volume season (MAY – SEP). As you will note in our standard statistical data, our call for service (CFS) volume has begun to drop a bit, which enabled us to reactivate our standard training program.

The steadiness of the year-over-year increases in our CFS volume and work output would be worthy of explanation, so I'll detail those briefly in the "Workload / Performance Metrics" section of the report. One of the traps to which law enforcement agencies (and governmental bodies in general) occasionally fall prey is a lack of effort in regard to explaining exactly what it is that we do, and why we do it. When agencies fail to operate transparently (or don't adequately explain the rationale behind their actions), lay persons can misinterpret the motives. This problem is especially acute in the law enforcement world, wherein a very complex mix of demographic, economic, sociological, and psychological issues affect (or should, anyway) our decisions on a daily basis.

I'll spare you the full lecture series (which my fourth-year criminology students claim can get a little tedious), but hopefully can at least provide a glimpse into the process by which we chart our course and attempt to remain that line between those who would victimize others and those who obey the law. We firmly believe in the notion that increasing the level of information folks have about what it is that we do and how we select our chosen tactics, can do nothing but strengthen the relationship between the community and the police department.

PERSONNEL ACTIONS:

SBPD initiated no demotions, terminations, disciplinary actions, or transfers during this reporting period.

SBPD filled our vacant telecommunications position during this reporting period by hiring Nicole Solarzano. Solarzano is now training in the SBPD dispatch operation pending assignment to her off-site Basic Telecommunicator Training Course.

We received one complaint against an officer during this reporting period. In accordance with our policy, the officer's chain of command thoroughly investigated the complaint by interviewing the complainant and officer, reviewing recordings of the

interaction, and reviewing the relevant policies and procedures. In this instance, a complainant reported that one of our supervisory officers had treated him disrespectfully during a vehicle stop. Subsequent to their investigation, the supervisor's chain of command concluded that no violation of policy occurred.

I reviewed their investigation and concurred by classifying the complaint as "unfounded" (one of the five dispositions available to us in accordance with our complaint investigation policy). Despite that finding, we nonetheless use each complaint as an opportunity to review potential problems and / or areas wherein we can improve our service level, and did so in this case.

We commended outstanding performance of duty by four officers involved in two separate incidents during this reporting period. Officers Byrd and Ridgeway displayed exemplary judgment, courage, and technical skill during a use of force incident (detailed in the next section) wherein the suspect not only assaulted the officers and fled on foot, but eventually drew a handgun from his pocket. In the second commendation, we acknowledge the fantastic, proactive beat work by SGT Don Sliker and CPL Lee Black. Sliker and Black detected a pair of suspicious persons walking along the road just before midnight, and within an hour had not only obtained confessions regarding a burglary planned for later the same evening, but had closed another break-in which occurred previously. Both commendation memoranda are included for your review.

HIGH RISK LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES:

SBPD conducted no vehicle pursuits during this reporting period.

SBPD officers conducted two foot-pursuits during this reporting period (both of which terminated in a use of force reported in this section).

One officer was injured on-duty during this reporting period.

We used a reportable level of force (standard handcuffing, escort holds, etc. do not require additional reporting beyond our Uniform Crime Report) in six instances during the reporting period. These incidents are summarized as follows:

1. **3 SEP 11**- Officer attacked from behind by suspect in our detention area during a busy Friday night / Saturday early morning shift. No injuries.
2. **3 SEP 11**- Same suspect again attacked two officers as they attempted to extract him from the cell for transport to the county jail. TASER used; no injuries.
3. **4 SEP 11**- Officers dispatched to "HCPD officer needs emergency assistance" call near the Garden City Connector. SBPD officers encountered the violent, escaping suspect running naked near Woodland and US 17. SBPD and HCPD officers pursued the suspect, caught him, and used a series of TASER strikes, hand-to-hand, and groundfighting techniques to finally subdue the suspect with only minor injuries (no officer injuries).
4. **13 SEP 11**- A suspect assaulted one of two officers who had stopped his vehicle and fled on foot, only to be apprehended less than one block away. As officers attempted to arrest the still resisting suspect he drew a loaded revolver from his front

pants pocket, but threw it down immediately as officers drew their sidearms. The resisting suspect was struck with a TASER and hand-to-hand strikes. The suspect and one officer were injured (both treated at area hospitals).

5. **27 SEP 11-** Officers responding to a tip regarding the whereabouts of a fugitive wanted by HCPD located the wanted suspect at a Surfside Beach residence and attempted to arrest him. A crowd of hostile persons interfered in the arrest, allowing the suspect to flee on foot. He was apprehended almost immediately after a brief pursuit, and assaulted the pursuing officer, who struck the suspect, forced him to the ground, and handcuffed him. No injuries.
6. **2 OCT 11-** Officers investigating a motor vehicle collision attempted to administer field sobriety tests to the driver, who assaulted the officers and attempted to escape. The female suspect continued to kick officers even after handcuffing, and was taken to the ground until subdued. No injuries.

SBPD's automatic review of all reported uses of physical force determined that all of the incidents during this reporting period fell within the guidelines promulgated by our internal policies, SC state law, and federal case law. Two of this month's incidents, however, are particularly noteworthy.

The 4 SEP assistance call involved a suspect who officers knew (even prior to their arrival) would be dangerous, in that he was displaying three behaviors which their training had informed them strongly indicated that the suspect was in a state of "excited delirium." Officers are trained to note when suspects disrobe, display bizarre or erratic behavior, and seem impervious to pain compliance techniques (even TASERS) they are most likely in a state of excited delirium, which is often drug-induced. It is suspected that, based upon the follow-up investigation, that this suspect had used PCP prior to his contact with law enforcement that evening. You will note if you review the report that the officers had been well-trained; they successfully used a variety of techniques very specific to these types of situations (multiple officer takedowns, drive stunning, and wrapping the suspect in a blanket to protect him during transport).

We praised the officers involved in the 13 SEP incident as much for the force they didn't use as that they did. The force deployed by the officers (although it hospitalized the suspect) was perfectly within guidelines. More importantly, when the suspect pulled the loaded revolver from his pocket, both officers immediately dropped their TASERS and drew their sidearms to defend themselves. The officer who first saw the weapon and had the most time to transition did not fire, because the second officer was too close to the suspect. In the one second or so he had in which to make that decision (as he was rolling on the ground in a dusky parking lot) the suspect threw the weapon down and went back to his original plan of physical assault. The officers, just as quickly and seamlessly, shifted right back with him and went back to hands-on and TASER. This kind of composure under intense pressure is exactly what we look for in officers, and these officers were commended for their efforts, as detailed previously.

TRAINING:

As we enter the Fall shoulder season, the SBPD training function will produce more in-house training, and officers will be better able to take advantage of off-site training opportunities due to the slightly lower CFS demands.

As always, officers maintained their Class 1 Law Enforcement licenses via online training provided by the SC Criminal Justice Academy, and continued to receive their mandated in-service hours through our contracted third-party vendor.

Additionally, SBPD officers completed the following advanced training:

1. Motorcycle Enforcement Training (14 SEP, Summerville, SC). Officers Byrd and Sanabria (designed to enhance motorcycle-related traffic enforcement, outlaw motorcycle gang enforcement, etc.).
2. Characteristics of Armed Gunmen (15 SEP, Columbia, SC). Officers Amundsen, Brode, and Turbeville (trains officers to detect subtle cues which tend to indicate that persons are concealing a handgun).
3. Detecting Deception in Written Statements (Columbia, SC). DET Prock (teaches investigative personnel to use psychological techniques to detect deception in suspect statements).
4. SC Training Officers Conference (26-28 SEP, North Myrtle Beach, SC). LT Keziah and SGT Bailey (multiple training tracks designed for training officers and licensed LE instructors).
5. Reid Interview Technique (27-29 SEP, Charleston, SC). CPT Miller and CPL Hofmann (course teaches the psychologically-based interrogation system adopted by SBPD for use when interviewing suspects).
6. Advanced Reid Technique (30 SEP, Charleston, SC). SGT Bailey and DET Prock (advanced techniques for officers already certified in the basic system).

Beginning next month, SBPD will conduct our annual consolidated in-service training to meet all of the practical skills requirements for licensing (weapons qualification, driving, etc.).

WORKLOAD / PERFORMANCE METRICS:

As usual, we've included our Monthly Activity Report (along with the same period last year spreadsheet for comparison purposes). Also included are the usual supplemental reports: the Criminal Investigations log, and the USMS Fugitive Task Force. Because we've shut down our seasonal Beach Services operation, no Beach Services Field Activities log is included.

This month, SBPD officers issued 75 written warnings in lieu of Uniform Traffic Tickets.

As mentioned in the introduction, you will no doubt notice that we (like other area agencies) continue to respond to a higher number of calls for service each year. This trend, although wholly legitimate, is affected by two primary sets of influences: External forces such as rising service populations, increased service demands, etc. and internal forces such as changes in reporting frequency and enforcement policies.

Although it may seem like simple semantics, it is important to understand the differences between some of the terms sociologists and government / civil planners use to describe populations. Permanent population is the number most often referred to by lay persons when comparing one city to another, but government planners (and police chiefs) worry much less about that number because they know that "service population" numbers are

much more important from a planning standpoint. Some cities experience an increase in service population during business hours, which is often the case in cities which serve as a county seat. Bedroom communities can actually decrease in population each day (as residents leave for work) and increase each evening as residents return home. Here in Horry County, our service population shifts are, obviously, connected to the tourism industry.

Real population analysis and examination of the impact on service demands is a little too involved for discussion in this format, but it is important for citizens (and our elected leaders) to know that we do analyze the numbers at a deeper level than simply comparing Census populations when they are released every ten years. Here in Surfside Beach, SBPD's increasing service demands are due to high tourism numbers, increased traffic counts on US 17, and an increase in rental property (primarily in the waterfront district). One other factor that greatly influences crime is population density. Generally, the denser the population, the higher the crime rate. During our lowest service demand months (DEC – FEB) our density is very low in that almost all of the transient population has departed. During our MAY – SEP season, however, we have one of the highest population density figures in the state of SC. Since density drives crime numbers, this is the figure we usually track in law enforcement.

Our unique situation here makes finding what we call a “demographic comp” for Surfside Beach almost impossible (we ran into this problem while we were researching the shift away from the public safety concept late last year). Our location in the Myrtle Beach Metropolitan Statistical Area also drives our traffic counts, bleedover crimes, and population shifts. By way of illustration, the 2010 Census shows Myrtle Beach at 27,000 permanent residents, but no serious person would compare their service demand with that of Anderson or Greer (just as you can't compare ours to Andrews). In civil planning (and especially in law enforcement), comparing apples to apples is important.

SBPD carefully analyzes our actual service demands, crime trends, and CFS volume to ensure that we're properly staffing to meet the needs of the community. The uniqueness of our situation often requires some creativity and flexibility in regard to staffing and organization, especially in regard to problems attendant to population shifts. We address relatively minor seasonal quality of life issues such as golf cart enforcement, fireworks complaints, and parking via specialized programs, even as we provide the standard, year-round law enforcement protections citizens expect.

For example, due to the 10 to 15-fold increase in our service population during our peak months, SBPD could not staff a parking enforcement operation from existing personnel. Thus, our Hospitality Tax-funded Parking Enforcement Team. By utilizing part-time employees and low-cost golf carts versus full-time employees and standard vehicles, we're able to keep an important presence out in the parking areas even well into the shoulder season. By dialing hours and coverage down as the season trails off, we're able to provide at least some illegal parking deterrent and observation ability for the entire parking season at very low cost. By the end of the season daily operational costs can fall below \$100 per day, although we view our parking enforcement efforts as a law and order / public safety service, not a revenue stream.

We staff similar, specially-funded programs to address other seasonal issues such as fireworks complaints. Because educating our transient tourist population in regard to local regulations pertaining to golf carts, fireworks, etc. is so difficult, we mitigate the problem by funding special duty night-time beach patrols each night throughout the peak season.

As if all of those factors weren't enough to confuse the issue, we also impact our own numbers internally. For example, we recently reassigned some duties and de-emphasized certain aspects of our traffic enforcement activities to re-orient those slots to combat traditional property crimes in the waterfront district and address important quality of life issues throughout our residential neighborhoods. These units now write fewer tickets, but arrest a higher number of criminal suspects. As discussed during a recent Council meeting, this can artificially skew some crime numbers, especially if the increase is a statistically significant one (as ours was).

The bottom line in regard to our workload analysis and performance metrics is that we want to assure you that we carefully examine the data and act accordingly. As is always the case, should you ever have a question in regard to our staffing or the manner in which we address a problem we'll be glad to provide the background data for you.

NOTABLE EVENTS / INFORMATION:

As usual, SBPD staffed a special detail for the annual Family Festival. The event was heavily attended, but we experienced only minor parking issues and made no arrests related to the event. Our dunking booth raised about \$500 for our chosen charity this year, the DSS Christmas Kids program.

SBPD authorized four Media Information Releases stemming from events and activities during this reporting period (they are included for your review).

The first details the arrest of the suspect who pulled the handgun on two of our officers. The next two detail a SC Law Enforcement Network traffic enforcement task force operation we conducted on 23 SEP, and the fourth release closes out our investigation of a serious motorcycle accident which occurred this summer.

I would like to commend you in regard to your exemplary performance of duty during your response to an assault (and flight) by a violent and dangerous suspect. The technical and tactical skill you displayed was impressive, as was the courage and professionalism which allowed you to successfully apprehend and subdue the suspect.

As you approached a suspicious vehicle that evening and developed reasonable suspicion that illegal drug activity was afoot, you properly required the suspect to exit the vehicle. The suspect immediately assaulted Ridgeway, and was chased down and tackled by Byrd within less than a block. The suspect continued to assault you both, despite being struck with a TASER device. During the continuing fight, the suspect was eventually able to reach into a pants pocket and retrieve a loaded revolver. Both of you drew your weapons to defend yourself, prompting the suspect to throw the weapon to the ground.

OFF Byrd's decision not to fire (a decision made, by the way, in the one second or so of time provided to make it) was the right one, due to OFF Ridgeway's proximity to the suspect and positioning relative to Byrd. By the time that the second or two ticked away and Ridgeway was able to disengage, the suspect had thrown his weapon to the ground. The suspect continued to fight, and you both remained composed, finished the job at hand, and arrested the suspect.

Your dedication to investigating suspicious persons, your technical expertise in detecting illegal drug activity, and the obvious courage you both displayed are commendable to say the least. Your judgment, however, won the night for you in that parking lot. Be proud of your work, because you displayed uncommon courage combined with uncommon grace under pressure (each is rare, together they are rarer still). Since you are both relatively inexperienced officers (at least compared to old washed up guys like me), allow me to give you one unsolicited piece of advice in regard to your actions on the night in question: pay attention to *this* assessment of your actions, not naysayers from other quarters who will question your actions, second-guess your decisions, and talk about what they "would have done..."

I daresay that very few (if any) of the armchair quarterbacks have rolled around in a dark parking lot with an armed suspect and faced a decision like the one you made (under the intense time constraints inherent to these life and death situations). I have, so trust me when I tell you how proud we are to have each of you as officers of this department and members of the brotherhood that is law enforcement.

Your actions removed a dangerous suspected criminal from the streets of Surfside Beach, and reflected very positively on you and the profession. Thank you.

I would like to commend you in regard to your exemplary performance of duty during a burglary and theft investigation initiated and completed by you at the patrol level. As officers and supervisors, you continue to display the kind of initiative and drive we aim to instill in our officers.

While on patrol you observed two suspicious males wearing dark clothing and backpacks in a residential neighborhood. Knowing that recent intel indicated that suspects matching that description and M.O. have committed crimes in Surfside Beach, you took the initiative to follow and eventually detain the suspects for field interviews. By carefully crafting your interview patter, you obtained consent to search and discovered evidence that a planned burglary was about to be committed.




The suspect was re-handcuffed (double-locked), and walked to the datamaster room.

Hernandez was walked to the holding cell and asked to go down on his knees. Officer Byrd and I decided to have the driver lay on his stomach and then we would remove the handcuffs due to Hernandez's assault earlier on Officer Byrd. Hernandez refused, tried to stand up, and was taken to the floor. Officer Byrd was able to remove one hand from the handcuffs and place it on Hernandez's head before he became violent again. Hernandez tried to take his left arm off his head and strike Officer Byrd. When Hernandez attempted to strike Officer Byrd, I drive stunned him with the Taser and told him to stop resisting. Hernandez complied for a few moments but again became violent and was drive stunned again. Officer Byrd was able to remove the handcuffs and we exited the jail cell. After we left the cell Hernandez began to hyperventilate. EMS was called to the jail and examined Hernandez. EMS checked his oxygen levels and said he did not need to be transported.

On September 4, 2011 at approximately 3:48A.M. officers were dispatched to Garden City Connector and Hwy 17 in reference to an Horry County Police Officer requesting emergency assistance with a naked subject. Dispatch advised the Horry County officer had tased Zimmerman and it did not work. Cpl King located Zimmerman running naked northbound on Hwy 17 near Woodland Dr with the County Police chasing him. The county officer tased Zimmerman again and this time he fell to the ground. While the county officer was tasing him I was able to handcuff Zimmerman's hands and double-lock them. Officer Byrd and Ridgeway arrived on scene. The county officer turned off his taser once Zimmerman was in handcuffs. Zimmerman attempted to get up and run again. Officer Byrd had Zimmerman by the left shoulder, county officer had his right shoulder, Cpl King held his legs, and Officer Ridgeway held the county officer's taser. Zimmerman tried to get up and began over powering the officers on the ground with him. Officer Ridgeway tased Zimmerman for the standard five seconds. The taser was not effective and Officer Byrd decided to drive stun Zimmerman in the back. The drive stun was effective and Zimmerman calmed down. A short time later Zimmerman again became violent and he was drive stunned by Officer Byrd. The Surfside Beach Police transport van was brought to the scene and officers attempted to place Zimmerman in the van. Zimmerman became violent again by kicking and attempting to pull away from officers. Zimmerman was placed on the ground and again drive stunned. Zimmerman was wrapped in a blanket and was able to be placed in the transport van. Zimmerman was transported to Conway Hospital by Cpl King and Officer Byrd. Once at the hospital Zimmerman was turned over to the Horry County Police and medical staff. It was later learned Zimmerman was under the influence of PCP.

While officers spoke with the suspect they smelled a distinct odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle, and observed loose tobacco in the passenger side door. Officers asked the suspect to step out of the vehicle and he immediately became agitated and displayed belligerent behavior.

After the suspect exited the car he used the vehicle to push away from Officer Ridgeway and a physical struggle ensued. The suspect was able to pull free and attempted to flee from the scene on foot. Officer Byrd was able to catch up to the suspect and both fell to the ground during a physical struggle. The suspect continued to resist officers and attempted to pull away from Officer Byrd.

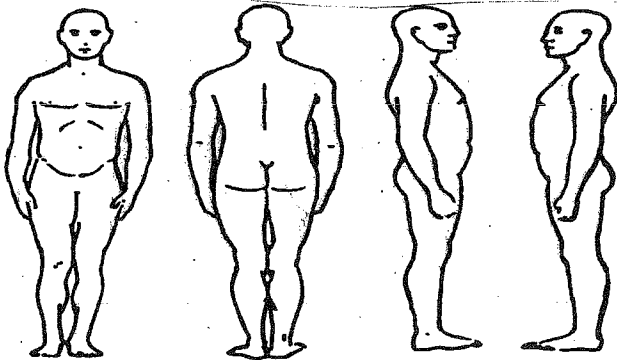
Officer Ridgeway then deployed his department issued taser and the suspect fell to the ground. During the deployment the suspect proceeded to reach into his right front pants pocket and pulled out a small revolver. At this time Officer Byrd pointed and presented his department issued firearm and the suspect proceeded to throw the weapon across the parking. Another attempt was made by the suspect to get up and flee the scene at which time Officer Byrd and Ridgeway tased the suspect again.

The subject then fell back to the ground and officers were able to handcuff the suspect. Officer Byrd and the suspect sustained injuries, which were treated by Horry County EMS.

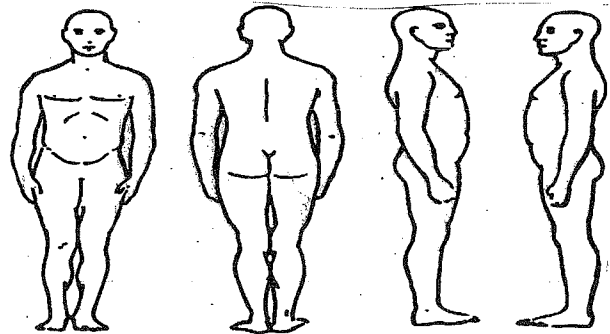

Cpl King and Officer Amundsen placed Matthews on the hood of a patrol car and attempted to obtain her hands. Once Matthews was handcuffed (double-locked) she was read her Miranda Rights. While Cpl King was reading Matthews her Miranda Rights she kicked Cpl King in the leg. Officer Amundsen and Cpl King took Matthews to the ground to avoid any further incidents.

RE: Suspect Draws Weapon on SBPD Officers; Suspect and Officer Injured During Arrest

SBPD patrol officers arrested a Myrtle Beach man Tuesday evening after he struck one officer, fled on foot, and eventually drew a revolver from his waistband. The suspect and one officer were injured during the ensuing struggle. Both were treated at local area hospitals and released later the same evening.

Two SBPD officers had stopped the vehicle STEELE was driving when they observed evidence of possible illegal drug activity within the vehicle. When they ordered STEELE from the car, he struck one officer and fled on foot. The second officer chased STEELE down and tackled him in a commercial parking lot approximately one block from the original assault. STEELE continued to assault the officer, and when the second officer arrived seconds later he shot STEELE with a TASER electrical stun device. STEELE then pulled a revolver from his waistband, but threw it down when officers drew their sidearms. After a second shot from the TASER device, STEELE was finally subdued and handcuffed.

STEELE suffered multiple lacerations and contusions, and was treated for a fractured bone at a local hospital. One SBPD officer suffered moderate lacerations to a hand and leg. During the search subsequent to STEELE's arrest, officers located five bags of suspected marijuana, one bag of suspected cocaine, and stolen credit cards. The handgun and a sum of cash were seized at the scene as well.

SBPD charged Omar Shareef STEELE (28, Myrtle Beach, SC) with the following offenses:

1. Assault on Officers while Resisting Arrest
2. Felon in Possession of Firearm
3. Carrying Concealed Weapon
4. Unlawful Possession of Weapon / Ammunition
5. Possession with Intent to Distribute Marijuana
6. Possession Cocaine
7. Possession Marijuana (2nd or subsequent offense)
8. Possession Cocaine with Intent near School or Park
9. Possession Marijuana with Intent near School or Park
10. Financial Transaction Card Theft

Late Tuesday evening, SBPD investigators (who had determined that STEELE had been enroute to a storage warehouse in Surfside Beach) executed a search warrant at the warehouse and recovered an additional firearm there.

STEELE appeared before a municipal judge Thursday for a bond hearing; he was remanded back to the county jail pending a \$62,000 cash/surety bond.

SBPD Chief of Police Mike Frederick expressed relief that no one was more seriously injured, and credits the outcome to the professionalism of the officers involved.

“It’s sometimes easy to fall into the trap of second-guessing officers in the field,” Frederick said, “but unless we’re the one rolling around on top of an armed drug suspect in a dark parking lot and making critical, life and death decisions in less than a second we try to avoid that practice. These guys did an outstanding job of locating this guy, chasing him down, and arresting him, despite the incredibly dangerous conditions. I hate that our officer was injured, but the outcome certainly could have been much worse.”

RE: Surfside Beach Police to Host Multi-Jurisdictional Traffic Safety Operation

The Surfside Beach Police Department will host a multi-jurisdictional public safety checkpoint operation in Surfside Beach on Friday, 23 SEP from 8 p.m. until 11:00 p.m. on Glenn's Bay Road (west of Highway 17 business). The checkpoint will be staffed with officers from throughout the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit, since the operation is part of the statewide Law Enforcement Network (LEN) highway safety program.

Officers from almost every law enforcement agency in Horry and Georgetown counties participate in the operations. SBPD expects approximately 40 officers to participate in Friday night's operation.

Officers will meet prior to the operation to discuss LEN business and brief on the operation.

SBPD Chief of Police Mike Frederick said that the regularly scheduled checkpoints move around to different parts of the two-county area, and are designed solely for the purpose of enhancing motorist safety.

"These operations not only publicize local agencies' dedication to highway safety," Frederick added, "but deter dangerous offenses such as driving under the influence and reckless driving."

RE: Surfside Beach Police Release Results of Friday Traffic Safety Operation

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The Surfside Beach Police Department released the final tally of their activity resulting from the traffic safety checkpoint operation they hosted late Friday evening on Glenn's Bay Road just west of US 17 Business in Surfside Beach.

SBPD Chief of Police Mike Frederick reported that 45 officers from 14 state and local agencies issued 68 traffic citations and arrested 10 persons on a variety of charges ranging from possession of crack cocaine, public intoxication, drivers' license violations, and Driving Under the Influence (DUI).

Frederick characterized the operation as "very successful," and added that these types of operations serve two purposes.

"We were, of course, stopping at least some portion of the motoring public from driving impaired by physically standing in the middle of the road Friday night," Frederick explained, "but hopefully the awareness we created continues to make the roads safer even after we've broken down the lights and signs and departed."

SBPD conducted the checkpoint operation as a member of the statewide Law Enforcement Network (LEN) traffic safety task force. The LEN conducts these operations around the state, utilizing task forces comprised of local agencies in each Judicial Circuit (the local LEN task force serves the Fifteenth Circuit – Horry and Georgetown counties).

The LEN maximizes both the enforcement and public awareness aspects of traffic safety by combining just a few officers from each jurisdiction to conduct a major checkpoint operation that would tax the resources of any single agency.

"Task forces like this are really the only method at our disposal for operations of this scale and efficacy," Frederick said.

Frederick further stated that a liaison officer from the SC Department of Public Safety / Office of Highway Safety (the state agency which oversees the management and funding of the

task force operations) provided a briefing for officers prior to the operation and worked the checkpoint that evening.

“A few folks gave us an earful on the side of the road Friday night,” Frederick said, “but we tried to explain that the public safety benefit of these operations far outweighs the relatively minor inconvenience.”

“It’s sobering to think about the fact that thus far in 2011 we’ve lost 382 courageous American souls in Iraq and Afghanistan,” Frederick added, “and 584 South Carolinians have died on our highways in the same period. That’s why we were out there.”

RE: SBPD Charges Motorcyclist with Felony DUI after Life-Threatening Collision

Traffic investigators with the Surfside Beach Police Department have charged a Shallotte, NC man with Felony DUI and Possession of Marijuana in relation to a serious motorcycle accident which occurred on 11 AUG. The suspect's life-threatening injuries sustained in the motorcycle versus van collision resulted in a long hospital stay, which delayed the arrest.

Investigators charged Jonathan PHILLIPS (w/m, 35, Shallotte, NC) with Felony DUI (Grave Bodily Injury) and Possession of Marijuana. PHILLIPS turned himself in this morning, was arrested, and appeared in bond court at 10:00 a.m. He was released after posting a \$15,000 surety bond.

The accident occurred on Melody Lane in Surfside Beach, when the motorcycle PHILLIPS was operating struck the rear of a full-sized van legally stopped in the roadway. Both PHILLIPS and his 35 year old female passenger sustained serious, life-threatening injuries during the accident. Investigators believe that PHILLIPS was impaired at the time of the 50+ mph collision, and found a bag of marijuana near PHILLIPS on the night of the accident. The passenger was wearing a helmet; PHILLIPS was not.

SBPD traffic investigators and the SC Highway Patrol's Multi-disciplinary Accident Investigation Team (MAIT) investigated the collision. Neither the van operator nor the passenger face charges.
