

director, trustee, or person with ultimate control of the organization shall not be deemed a necessary expense of operation.

Classification means that division of businesses by major groups subject to the same license rate as determined by a calculated index of ability to pay based on national averages, benefits, equalization of tax burden, relationships of services, or other basis deemed appropriate by town council.

Gross income means the total revenue of a business, received or accrued, for one (1) calendar year collected or to be collected from business done within the town, excepting there from income from business done wholly outside of the town on which a license tax is paid to some other municipality or a county and fully reported to the town. Gross income for brokers or agents means gross commissions received or retained, unless otherwise specified. Gross income for insurance companies means gross premiums collected. Gross income for business license tax purposes shall not include taxes collected for a governmental entity, escrow funds, or funds that are the property of a third party. The value of bartered goods or trade-in merchandise shall be included in gross income. The gross income for business license purposes may be verified by inspection of returns and reports filed with the Internal Revenue Service, the South Carolina Department of Revenue, the South Carolina Insurance Commission, or other governmental agency.

License Official means any person designated to administer this article.

Person means any individual, firm, partnership, LLP, LLC, cooperative nonprofit membership, corporation, joint venture, association, estate, trust, business trust, receiver, syndicate, holding company, or other group or combination acting as a unit, in the singular or plural, and the agent or employee having charge or control of a business in the absence of the principals.

Place of Business means a location identified by a unique and separate Tax Map Number by the County Assessor for Horry County, South Carolina

Town means the Town of Surfside Beach, South Carolina.

Town Council means the town council of the Town of Surfside Beach, South Carolina.

Sec. 4-3. PURPOSE AND DURATION.

The business license levied by this ordinance is for the purpose of providing such regulation as may be required by the businesses subject thereto and for the purpose or raising revenue for the general fund through a privilege tax. Each license shall be issued for one (1) year and shall expire on May 31. The provisions of this article and the rates herein shall remain in effect from year to year as amended by town council.

SEC. 4-4. LICENSE FEE.

- (a) The required license fee shall be paid for each business subject hereto according to the applicable rate classification on or before the first day of June in each year, except for those businesses in Rate Class 8 for which a different due date is specified.
- (b) A separate license shall be required for each place of business and for each classification or business conducted at or from that place of business. Where more than one calling, business, occupation or profession is conducted at or from a place of business, a separate business license is required for each such calling, business, occupation or profession. If gross income cannot be separated for classifications at one location, the license fee shall be computed on the combined gross income for the classification requiring the highest rate. A license fee based on gross income shall be computed on the gross income for the preceding calendar or fiscal year, and on a twelve-month projected income based on the monthly average for a business in operation for less than one (1) year. The fee for a new business shall be computed on the estimated probable gross income stated in the license application for the balance of the license year. The initial fee for an annexed business shall be prorated for the number of months remaining in the license year. No refund shall be made for a business that discontinues operation or changes ownership prior to expiration of a license year.

Sec. 4-5. REGISTRATION REQUIRED.

- (a) The owner, agent, or legal representative of every business subject to this article, whether listed in the classification index or not, shall register the business and make application for a business license on or before the due date of each year, except that a new business shall be required to have a business license prior to operation within the town.
- (b) Application shall be on a form provided by the license official which shall contain the Social Security number and/or the federal employer's identification number, the business name as reported on the South Carolina income tax return, and all information about the applicant and the business deemed appropriate to carry out the purpose of this ordinance by the license official. Applicants may be required to submit copies of portions of state and federal income tax returns reflecting gross income figures.
- (c) The applicant shall certify under oath that the information given in the application is true, that the gross income is accurately reported, or estimated for a new business, without any unauthorized deductions, and that all assessments and personal property taxes on business property due and payable to the Town have been paid.
- (d) Insurance agents and brokers shall report the name of each insurance company for which a policy was issued and the total premiums collected for each company for each type of insurance coverage on a form approved by the license official. An insurance agent not employed by a company shall be licensed as a broker.

Sec. 4-6. DEDUCTIONS, EXEMPTIONS, AND CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS.

- (a) No deductions from gross income shall be made except income from business done wholly outside of the town on which a license tax is paid to some other municipality, or a county, taxes collected for a governmental entity, or income which cannot be taxed pursuant to state or federal law. The applicant shall have the burden to establish the right to deduction by satisfactory records and proof.
- (b) No person shall be exempt from the requirements of this article by reason of the lack of an established place of business within the town, unless exempted by state or federal law. The license official shall determine the appropriate classification for each business in accordance with the latest issue of the U.S. Office of Management and Budget Standard Industrial Classification Manuals and Codes ("SIC Codes"). No person shall be exempt from this ordinance by reason of the payment of any other tax, unless exempted by state law, and no person shall be relieved of the liability for the payment of any other tax by reason of the application of this article.
- (c) Charitable organizations which have exemptions from state and federal income taxes shall be exempt from a business license tax only in cases where the sponsors, organizers, directors, trustees, or persons who exercise ultimate control of the organization receive no part of the proceeds of operation, and all proceeds are devoted to charitable purposes as defined by this article. Payment of necessary costs of operation and wages to non-management employees will not disqualify a charitable organization from exemption.

Sec. 4-7. FALSE APPLICATION UNLAWFUL.

It shall be unlawful for any person subject to the provisions of this article to make a false application for a business license, or to give or file, or direct the giving or filing of any false information with respect to the license or fee required by this article.

Sec. 4-8. DISPLAY AND TRANSFER.

- (a) All persons shall display the license issued to them on the original form provided by the license official in a conspicuous place in the business establishment at the address shown on the license. An itinerant, transient, or nonresident business operator shall carry the license upon his or her person or in a vehicle used in the business readily available for inspection by any authorized agent of the town.
- (b) A change of address must be reported to the license official within ten (10) days after removal of the business to a new location and the license will be valid at the new address upon written notification of the license official and compliance with zoning and building codes. Failure to obtain the approval of the license official for a change of address shall invalidate the license and may subject the licensee to prosecution for doing business without a license. A business license shall not be transferable and a transfer of controlling interest shall be considered a termination of the old business and the establishment of a new business requiring a new business license based on old business income.

Sec. 4-9. ADMINISTRATION OF ORDINANCE.

The license official shall administer the provisions of this article, collect license fees, issue licenses, make or initiate investigations and audits to insure compliance, initiate denial or revocation procedures, issue a summons for violations of this ordinance and assist in prosecution of violator, produce forms, make reasonable regulations relating to the administration of this ordinance, and perform such other duties as may be duly assigned.

Sec. 4-10. INSPECTION AND AUDITS.

- (a) For the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this article the license official or other authorized agent of the town is empowered to enter upon the premises of any person subject to this article to make inspections, examine and audit books and records, and it shall be unlawful for any such person to fail or refuse to make available the necessary books and records. In the event an audit or inspection reveals that false information has been filed by the licensee, the costs of the audit shall be added to the correct license fee and late penalties in addition to other penalties provided herein. Each day of failure to pay the proper amount of license fee shall constitute a separate offense.
- (b) The license official shall make systematic inspections and random audits of all businesses within the town to insure compliance with the article. Records of inspections and audits shall not be deemed public records, and the license official shall not release the amount of license taxes paid or the reported gross income of any person by name without written permission of the licensee, provided that statistics compiled by classifications may be made public.
- (c) A licensee who does not keep the books and records of the business upon the premises whereat the business of the licensee is conducted within the town, or whose books and records are otherwise located outside the town, shall make the books and records of the business available to the license official for the purpose of examination and audit; and the licensee shall be responsible for physically delivering such books and records to the license official upon written notice for such delivery, such notice to specify the time, date and place within the town, to which such books and records are to be delivered.

SEC. 4-11 ASSESSMENTS, PAYMENT UNDER PROTEST, APPEAL.

- (a) When any person shall have failed to obtain a business license or to furnish the information required by this article, the license official shall proceed to examine such records of the business, public records, statistical samples, or other available records and information as may be deemed appropriate to assess a license fee and penalties as provided herein.
- (b) A notice of assessment shall be served by certified mail. An application for adjustment of the assessment may be made to the license official within five (5) days after the notice is mailed or the assessment will become final. The license official shall establish by

regulation the procedure for hearing an application for adjustment of assessment and issuing a notice of final assessment.

- (c) A final assessment may be appealed to the board of fee appeals constituted hereunder only by payment in full of the assessment under protest within five (5) days and the filing of written notice of appeal within ten (10) days after payment pursuant to the provisions of this article relating to appeals to the board of fee appeals.

SEC. 4-12. DELINQUENT LICENSE FEES, PARTIAL PAYMENT, FAILURE TO OBTAIN A LICENSE, ENFORCEMENT.

- (a) For nonpayment of all or any part of the correct license fee, the license official shall levy and collect a late penalty of five (5) percent of the unpaid fee for each month or portion thereof after the due date until paid, provided, however, that the late penalty to be collected for any one year's delinquent fee shall not exceed thirty (30%) percent of the fee due for that license year. If any license fee shall remain unpaid for sixty (60) days after its due date, the license official shall immediately notify the town's attorney of the delinquent business license payers as being in violation of this article, and the town's attorney may commence such legal action as he deems appropriate. Penalties imposed pursuant to this section shall not be waived for any reason.
- (b) Partial payment may be accepted by the license official to toll imposition of penalties on the portion paid; provided, however, no business license shall be issued or renewed until the full amount of the tax due, with penalties, has been paid.
- (c) Unpaid license fees, penalties and costs chargeable to a delinquent license payer shall constitute a lien against the property of the delinquent license payer, shall be recorded as such in the public records of Horry County, and may enforced through foreclosure.
- (d) The license official shall levy and collect an additional five (5) percent penalty or \$25.00, whichever is greater for businesses that begin operating within the municipality without being properly licensed by the Town.
- (e) The town attorney may use the South Carolina Setoff Debt Collection Act, S.C. Code Ann. § 12-56-10 *et seq.* (as amended) as a method to collect unpaid license fees, penalties, and costs chargeable to a delinquent license payer, and the Town shall in such case be a "claimant agency" as that statute defines the same.

Sec. 4-13. NOTICES.

The license official may, but shall not be required to, mail written notices, in the form of a renewal application or other format as the license official deems appropriate, that license fees are due, but if notices are not mailed, there shall be published a notice of the due date in a newspaper

of general circulation within the town three (3) times prior to the due date in each year. Failure to receive notice shall not constitute a defense to prosecution for failure to pay the tax due or grounds for waiver of penalties.

Sec. 4-14. DENIAL OF LICENSE.

The license official shall deny a license to an applicant when the application is incomplete, contains a misrepresentation, false or misleading statement, is unsigned; or the applicant evades, suppresses or refuses to furnish the license official information material to the proper issuance of the license; or the activity for which the license is sought is unlawful or, constitutes a public nuisance; or the applicant fails to first comply with any provision of this article, or other ordinance regulating the business, the business property, or the business location. A decision of the license official shall be subject to appeal before the board of fee appeals as herein provided. Denial shall be written with reasons stated.

SEC. 4-15. SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF LICENSE

When the license official determines that:

- (1) A license has been mistakenly or improperly issued or issued contrary to law; or
- (2) A licensee has breached any condition upon which the license was issued or has failed to comply with the provisions of this article; or
- (3) A licensee has obtained a license through a fraud, misrepresentation, a false or misleading statement, evasion or suppression of a material fact in the license application; or
- (4) A licensee has been convicted of an offense under a law or ordinance regulating business, a crime involving moral turpitude, or an unlawful sale of merchandise or prohibited goods; or
- (5) A licensee has engaged in an unlawful activity or nuisance related to the business; or
- (6) A licensee has failed or refused to comply with any provisions of this article or other ordinance regulating the business, the business property or the business location; then

The License official shall give written notice to the licensee of the person in control of the business within the town by personal service or certified mail that the license is suspended pending a hearing before the board of fee appeals for the purpose of determining whether the license should be revoked. The notice shall state the time and place at which the hearing is to be held, which shall be at a meeting of the board of fee appeals within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the notice, unless continued by agreement. The notice shall contain a brief statement of the reasons for suspension and proposed revocation and a copy of the applicable provisions of this article.

SEC. 4-16 . APPEALS TO BOARD OF FEE APPEALS.

- (a) A board of fee appeals shall be constituted to hear and determine appeals from the license official, but shall not have jurisdiction to alter, amend or suspend the rates imposed by the Town Council for the issuance of business licenses. The board shall consist of a chairman and two other persons, and shall meet as required. All appointed members of the board shall be residents of the Town. The Town's treasurer shall serve an ex officio member. No appointed member of the board shall be an employee of the Town or a member of the Town Council, and all members shall serve at the pleasure of the Town Council for not more than two consecutive terms, each of four (4) years. There shall be no payment for service on the board, however the Town Administrator may reimburse actual expenses necessarily incurred by the members of the board.
- (b) Any person aggrieved by a decision, final assessment, revocation, suspension, or a denial of a business license by the license official may appeal the decision to the board of fee appeals by written request stating the reasons thereof, filed with the license official within ten (10) days after the payment of the assessment under protest or notice of denial is received. Payment under protest shall be a condition precedent to appeal.
- (c) An appeal or a hearing on revocation shall be held by the board of fee appeals within thirty (30) days after receipt of a request for appeal or service of notice of suspension at a meeting of which the applicant or licensee has been given written notice, unless continued by agreement. At such hearing all parties shall have the right to be represented by counsel, to present testimony and evidence and to cross-examine witnesses. The proceedings shall be recorded and transcribed at the expense of the party so requesting. The rules of evidence and procedure prescribed by state law shall govern the hearing. The board of fee appeals shall by majority vote of members present render a written decision based on findings of fact and application of the standards herein which shall be served upon all parties or their representatives and shall be final unless appealed to a court of competent jurisdiction within ten (10) days after service.
- (d) Any appeal from the board of fee appeals shall lie to the Circuit Court for Horry County.
- (e) No person shall be subject to prosecution for doing business without a license until the expiration of ten (10) days after notice of denial or revocation which is not appealed or until after final judgment of a circuit court upholding denial or revocation.

Sec. 4-17. PERMISSION TO USE STREETS REQUIRED.

It shall be unlawful for any person to construct, install, maintain, or operate in, on, above, or under any street or public place under control of the town any line, pipe, cable, pole, structure, or facility for utilities, communications, cablevision, or other purposes without a consent agreement or franchise agreement issued by the town council by ordinance which prescribes the term, fees, and conditions for use.

Sec. 4-18. CONSENT, FRANCHISE, OR BUSINESS FEE REQUIRED.

The annual fee for use of streets or public places authorized by a consent agreement or franchise agreement shall be set by the ordinance approving the agreement and shall be consistent with limits set by state law. Existing franchise agreements shall continue in effect until expiration dates in the agreements. Franchise and consent fees shall not be in lieu of or be credited against business license fees unless specifically provided by the franchise or consent agreement.

SEC. 4-19 CONFIDENTIALITY

Except in accordance with proper judicial order or as otherwise provided by law, it shall be unlawful for any official or employee to divulge or make known in any manner the amount of income or any particulars set forth or disclosed in any report or return required under this ordinance. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the publication of statistics so classified as to prevent the identification of particular reports or returns, or the transmission or sharing of information derived from a license application or return to other public officials or employees for the proper performance of their duties.

Sec. 4-20. VIOLATIONS.

Any person violating any provision of this article shall be deemed guilty of an offense and may be subject to a fine of up to five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days, or both, upon conviction. Each day of violation shall be considered a separate offense. Punishment for violation shall not relieve the offender of liability for delinquent taxes, penalties, and costs provided herein.

Sec. 4-20.1. SEPARABILITY.

A determination that any portion of this article is invalid or unenforceable shall not affect the remaining portions.

SEC. 4-20.2 CLASSIFICATION AND RATES

- (a) The sectors of businesses included in each rate class are listed with the U.S. Office of Management and Budget Standard Industrial Classification Manuals and Codes ("SIC Codes"). The alphabetical index in this article is a tool for classification, not a limitation on businesses subject to a license tax. The license official shall determine the proper class for a business according to the applicable SIC Code, whether or not the business is listed in the alphabetical index.
- (b) The license fee for each class of business subject to this article shall be computed in accordance with the following rates:

Unless otherwise specifically provided, all fees and rates shall be doubled for businesses having no fixed principal place of business within the town.

CLASS 8 RATES

Each SIC number designates a separate subclassification. The businesses in this section are treated as separate and individual subclasses due to provisions of state law, regulatory requirements, service burdens, tax equalization considerations, etc., which are deemed to be sufficient to require individually determined rates. Non-residents rates do not apply except where indicated.

- A trailer or other temporary structure at the construction site, is not a permanent place of business under this article.
- The total fee for the full amount of a one time project or contract of an out of town contractor shall be paid prior to commencement of work—and shall entitle the contractor to complete the job within the license period. The cost to extend the license issued for the projector contract shall require the applicant to pay the base fee in compliance with the schedule noted in “B and C above.” Under no circumstances shall a Contractor be allowed to begin another project or contract under the business licensed issued or extended. All new projects require a new business license.
- No contractor shall be issued a business license until all state and town license requirements have been met. Each contractor shall post a sign in plain view on each job identifying the contractor with the job.
- Subcontractors shall be licensed on the same basis as general or prime contractors for the same job, and no deductions shall be made by a general or prime contractor for value of work performed by a subcontractor.
- Zoning permits must be obtained when required by the Town’s zoning ordinances.
- Each primary (prime) contractor shall file with the building department a list of subcontractors furnishing labor or materials for each project.

ARTICLE II. PEDDLING AND SOLICITING

Sec. 4-21. PEDDLER’S PERMIT AND BUSINESS LICENSE REQUIRED.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any peddler, drummer, or solicitor to call at any private or public residence or dwelling for the purpose of selling or offering for sale, goods, wares, or services, unless such person has first obtained a permit to solicit for which he or she shall pay a peddler's license fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). For profit business shall have a current town business license, unless otherwise exempt as set forth herein below. Every person shall have a town issued permit and personal identification in their possession when soliciting, which shall be presented to patrons, donors, or town officials upon request.

(b) Any nonresident or transient business applicant to the town shall first produce a license issued by the State of South Carolina or by the clerk of court of the county pursuant to S.C. Code 1976, § 40-41-10.

(c) Applicants shall submit the following information, as applicable, to the administrator or designated official at least ten (10) days prior to solicitation dates:

- (1) The dates during which solicitation will occur;
- (2) A copy of each solicitor's driver's license or other commonly accepted photo identification;
- (3) A copy of the organization's federal identification number;
- (4) A copy of the organization's federal and/or state exemption status documentation;
- (5) A copy of the current town business license;
- (6) A copy of the South Carolina or county business license.

(d) Solicitation by any peddler, drummer, solicitor, or business, regardless of whether the solicitation is charitable or for-profit, may not occur more than twice per calendar year for more than three (3) days each.

Sec. 4-22 INTERSTATE COMMERCE.

A person or business engaged exclusively in interstate commerce is not subject to a business license by the town; however, a peddler's permit must be obtained as required by this article. Wherein interstate and intrastate activities of a business can be separated, the intrastate portion shall be licensed as required by section 4-21. Any foreign corporation or business must be registered with the State of South Carolina and provide proof of a South Carolina tax reporting number prior to permit issuance.

Sec. 4-23. SPECIAL EVENTS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, hawk, peddle, drum, solicit, etc., goods, wares or provisions of any kind without a valid business license. Such license shall only be issued for the sale of such goods, wares, or provisions as are by custom sold at such events, and such license shall only be valid at the location of and during the time period in which such event is conducted. The Town may grant an exception at an official Town-recognized festive or sportive event where the Town has agreed to accept and the vendor or event promoter has paid to the Town a special event fee in lieu of a business license.

Sec. 4-24. ROADSIDE VENDORS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale any goods or wares as a roadside vendor. This provision shall not apply to persons selling or offering to sell fresh provisions provided such person provides adequate off-street parking for motor vehicles, and does not establish the location of such provisions nearer than one hundred fifty (150) feet from the boundaries of a street right-of-way.

Sec. 4-25. SOLICITATION FOR CHARITABLE PURPOSES.

(a) [*Permissions to solicit required.*] It shall be unlawful for any person to solicit or attempt to solicit for charitable purposes unless written permission is obtained in advance from the town administrator or designated representative. "Charitable purpose" means benevolent, philanthropic, patriotic, or eleemosynary purpose, which does not result in personal gain to a sponsor, organizer, officer, director, trustee, or person with ultimate control of the organization as defined by section 4-2. It shall be the duty of the administrator or designated official to investigate each applicant to ensure that the solicitation is for a legitimate charitable organization recognized by the state or the Internal Revenue Service. The administrator or designated official shall have sole discretion to determine if the request is worthy of assistance by the citizens of the town.

(b) [*Issuance of permit.*] If the town administrator or designated representative finds that the solicitation is for a valid charitable purpose, under the control and supervision of responsible and reliable persons, then such official shall authorize issuance of a permit.

(c) [*Exemption for proselytizing.*] Religious organizations soliciting for the sole purpose of proselytizing within the town's corporate limit shall be exempt hereunder; provided, however, that said religious organization's representatives shall immediately leave the premises of any resident upon being requested to do so.

Sec. 4-26. FALSE STATEMENTS.

Upon discovery that the solicitation campaign has resulted in the occurrence of a misrepresentation of facts or the making of untrue statements, the town administrator or designated representative shall immediately suspend such permits and/or licenses and present to the holder of the permit and/or license a notice of suspension.

Sec. 4-27. PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN PLACES.

No selling, peddling, hawking, drumming or commercial solicitation is allowed on the beach, town streets, town sidewalks, walkways to beach or other public property.

Sec. 4-28. PERSONS IN VEHICLES.

Literature cannot be distributed to anyone in a vehicle, parked or moving. Other methods of solicitation cannot be attempted or contact made with anyone in a vehicle, parked or moving.

Sec. 4-29. VIOLATIONS.

Any person violating any provision of this article shall be deemed guilty of an offense and may be subject to a fine of up to five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days, or both, upon conviction. Each day of violation shall be considered a separate offense. Punishment for violation shall not relieve the offender of liability for delinquent taxes, penalties, and costs provided herein.

ARTICLE III. CONTRACTING TRADES AND SERVICES*

Sec. 4-41. CONTRACTORS DEFINED; VALID BUSINESS LICENSE REQUIRED.

(a) Every person, firm or corporation receiving any type of compensation undertaking the listed types of contracting services or any similar type of service not otherwise classified in which social security and income taxes are not being withheld weekly and a W-2 issued as an employee of an owner, prime contractor or subcontractor shall be considered an individual contractor for the purpose of this article.

In cases where doubt may exist as to whether a person is an employee as defined above, the burden of proof shall be on the person to produce copies of current payroll records to indicate full time employment.

(b) Persons, firms or corporations defined as a contractor furnishing labor, supervision or providing any type of contracting services for any form of compensation shall be subject to all licensing, registration, certification or permit requirements and liable for payment of the business license fees herein set forth on the same basis as the prime contractor.

(c) Charitable organizations not receiving any form of compensation for their contracting services may be exempt from payment of business license fees but must still meet all requirements for permits, licensing, certification or registration as indicated in section 4-42 below.

(d) It shall be a violation of this article for any contractor or subcontractor to engage or offer to engage in any construction activity without having first obtained a valid business license and if awarded a contract obtain the necessary permits from the town.

Sec. 4-42. CONSTRUCTION TRADES SUBJECT TO STATE LICENSING, CERTIFICATION, OR REGISTRATION; COST LIMITS FOR CONTRACTS.

(a) The following types of construction trades listed in subsection (b) for commercial or residential work requires a state license, certification or registration from:

South Carolina Contractors Licensing Board

South Carolina Residential Builders Commission

South Carolina State Fire Marshall

Municipal Association of South Carolina

South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control

City of Myrtle Beach Master Trade Certification combined with the South Carolina Residential Builders registration

(b) All trades, subject to Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, must have a current state license, registration or certification, before commencing work in the Town of Surfside Beach. Trades are listed in the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, Sections 40-59-5, et. seq. and 40-11-5, et. seq.

(c) All limitations imposed by the state and town based on the type of license, certification or registration issued shall be observed.

(d) Contractors and subcontractors only registered by the South Carolina Residential Builders Commission shall be limited to a maximum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) per commercial or residential project based on the total cost unless working under a permit obtained by a licensed general contractor or residential builder. The cost of the undertaking for the purposes of this article shall include the total cost of materials, equipment and labor. The splitting up of a contract by the various trades, using separate contracts or property owners furnishing materials in order for a contractor or subcontractor to exceed the five thousand dollar (\$5,000.00) limit shall not be allowed. When the cost of an undertaking performed by a residential specialty contractor exceeds five thousand dollars, the residential specialty contractor must obtain an executed bond with a surety in an amount approved by the Residential Builders Commission.

Separate contracts used by registered contractors that exceed the limit imposed per project shall have a minimum waiting period of thirty (30) days from completion of the previous contract before another permit will be issued. Contractors or subcontractors only registered shall not be issued a license to perform general contracting, residential homebuilding, plumbing, electrical, fire protection, exterminating, HVAC mechanical or other trades that require examination until certified by an approved license exam.

(e) Possession, use or attempted use of another person's state license, registration, certification or town license shall be a violation of this article.

Sec. 4-43. CERTAIN CONTRACTORS NOT SUBJECT TO STATE LICENSING, CERTIFICATION, ETC.

Any contractors exempted from any state licensing requirement, regardless of trade, must have a Town Business License to perform work within the Town's corporate limits.

Sec. 4-45. RIGHT OF TOWN TO RULE ON NECESSITY FOR LICENSING FOR AND TO CLARIFY CONSTRUCTION TRADES.

The classifications listed in sections 4-42 and 4-43 of this article may not be inclusive. The town reserves the right to rule on the necessity for licensing and classify construction trades necessary to meet any federal, state or local laws that may be imposed and to protect the health and safety of the citizens of the Town of Surfside Beach.

Sec. 4-46. CONSTRUCTION OR REPAIRS BY PROPERTY OWNERS.

In the interest of public health, safety, welfare, the protection of building occupants, future subsequent property owners and their visitors, the Town of Surfside Beach regulates the construction activities a property owner may perform on their own property that require permits and inspections unless properly qualified for such activities.

(1) *New construction, additions, structural alterations or improvements:*

a. A property owner may act as a general contractor and subcontract work or construction trades on a detached single-family residence in which they reside only if all of the following conditions are met:

1. The property owner should possess knowledge and expertise in the construction field. Work performed shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations, building codes, and zoning ordinances.
2. The property owner must be capable of performing supervision on the job site. Supervision of the work shall not be delegated to anyone other than a properly licensed residential builder or general contractor.
3. The property owner shall not receive a wage, fee or commission for his participation in the project. The structure shall not be offered for sale, lease or rent for at least two (2) years after issuance of a certificate of occupancy.
4. A complete list of all contractors or persons to be involved on the project shall be submitted and approved by the building and zoning department prior to any permits being issued.
5. Contractors or persons providing labor or services to a property owner shall be licensed, insured and limited to state and local license limitations based on a valuation of materials and labor to be used in the course of their work.
6. Each subcontractor shall be responsible for obtaining a separate permit for their portion of labor, materials and profit. The difference in construction valuation between subcontracts and the total job valuation for permit fee calculation shall be the responsibility of the property owner for payment.

b. For an owner to obtain a permit to perform any structural carpentry, (not applicable to detached structures less than four hundred (400) square feet) an owner shall be qualified by having a South Carolina Residential Builders or General Contractors License. To perform any mechanical trades (electrical, gas, fire protection, plumbing, or heating and air conditioning work) an owner shall be qualified by having the appropriate South Carolina Mechanical Contractors License or hold a valid master trade certification from an approved agency or municipality.

(2) *Commercial property:*

a. Permits shall not be issued to any property owner for any construction trades or work to be performed other than defined ordinary minor repairs on any property where the general public will have access, that is used for commercial purposes or residential property that is to be offered for sale, lease or rent unless properly licensed for such undertaking.

(3) *Residential repairs and nonstructural alterations (owner-occupied primary home only):*

a. A qualified property owner may obtain a special homeowners permit to perform general repairs, nonstructural alterations, electrical, plumbing, heating and air conditioning trades on their own residential property, in which they occupy as a primary residence (but not including property intended for rent, sale or gift), provided he first makes an application for and obtains a special homeowner's permit from the building and zoning department to do the specific work contemplated.

1. Qualified property owner. One who has passed a required town trade qualification exam in specific trades (building, electrical, plumbing, heating and air conditioning) for the purpose of being issued a special homeowner's permit.

2. Special homeowner's permit. A permit issued to a property owner for general repairs or alterations of nonstructural building components, electrical, plumbing, heating and air conditioning on their own primary dwelling in which they reside.

b. No such special permit shall be issued unless the applicant satisfies the town that they are competent by passing a qualification exam or showing credentials indicating they are capable of performing the work requested.

c. Once so satisfied, the town shall issue a permit to the applicant personally to perform the particular work for which the application was made. Such permit shall extend to the applicant only and shall not authorize the applicant to use the services of any other person to assist them unless such other person is a properly licensed contractor with their own permit. The permit granted the applicant shall automatically expire upon completion of the work which application was made and the permit issued. All work done under such permit shall be subject to town inspection requirements and fees along with satisfying all statutory and ordinance requirements applicable to such work.

d. These types of special permits are not for new construction, additions or structural alterations nor are these permits transferable or refundable.

e. All applications for special homeowner permits shall be accompanied by a homeowner affidavit sealed by a notary.

(4) *Certificates of occupancy*: Failure of the property owner to request and receive all required inspections and receive a final certificate of occupancy shall result in the denial of any type of future permit requests for that particular property until all outstanding inspections are performed, passed and the appropriate certificate issued.

If no inspections have been requested or an extension of a permit granted within a six-month period the permit will be declared null and void as required by code and a new permit shall be obtained. Failure to obtain a new permit will constitute a building code violation subject [to] all penalties allowed by law.

Sec. 4-47. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES APPLICABLE TO CONTRACTORS SUBCONTRACTORS AND PROPERTY OWNERS.

(a) All information required on business license applications must be completed.

(b) Permit applications must be obtained, completely filled out, submitted, approved and fees paid before any work may begin on any project. Some projects will require plan reviews.

(c) Any contractor, subcontractor, or individual working for or receiving compensation directly from a property owner shall meet the state's bonding requirements. Failure to maintain bond required will be a violation of this article and will be sufficient grounds for license revocation or denial of additional permits and certificates of occupancy.

(d) Whenever a permit is required from the building department the owner or prime contractor shall require every contractor, subcontractor or individual not classified as an employee providing services on the project to be listed on a subcontractor list for each permit issued. Subcontractors or persons not listed on the subcontractors list found working on the job site will be in violation of this article. Certificates of occupancy will be withheld on all projects until the subcontractor list is verified.

(e) It shall be necessary on each job for the prime contractor to post in plain view a sign identifying himself with the project. Any building permit issued shall be posted in a conspicuous place visible from the street and protected from the elements.

(f) Property owners and/or prime contractors shall bear full responsibility and will be in violation of this article for knowingly hiring any subcontractors that have not first proved meeting the requirements of this article. Stop work orders will also be issued on any project where unlicensed or unregistered contractors or subcontractors are found working.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

1. If any provision, clause, sentence, or paragraph of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be held invalid, that invalidity shall not affect the other provisions of this article which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this article are declared to be severable.
2. Effect of section headings: The headings or titles of the several sections hereof shall be solely for convenience of reference and shall not affect the meaning, construction, interpretation or effect of this Ordinance.
3. Repeal and Effective Date: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval at Second Reading by the Town Council of the Town of Surfside Beach, South Carolina.
